SHAH ALAM - Gangguan bekalan air di enam wilayah membabitkan Petaling, Klang, Shah Alam, Gombak, Kuala Lumpur dan Kuala Selangor mula disalurkan secara berperingkat setelah sistem air distabilkan bermula jam 12 tengah hari pada Ahad.

SHAH ALAM - Gangguan bekalan air di enam wilayah membabitkan Petaling, Klang, Shah Alam, Gombak, Kuala Lumpur dan Kuala Selangor mula disalurkan secara berperingkat setelah sistem air distabilkan bermula jam 12 tengah hari pada Ahad.

Gangguan bekalan air berlaku berikutan pengurangan pengeluaran air terawat di Loji Rawatan Air (LRA) Rantau Panjang, Sungai Selangor Fasa 1 (SSP1), SSP2 dan SSP 3 berikutan kekeruhan air mentah tinggi akibat aliran kepala air di Sungai Kerling awal pada Sabtu.

Pengurusan Air Selangor Sdn Bhd (Air Selangor) memaklumkan, kesemua LRA Rantau Panjang, SSP1, SSP2 dan SSP3 telah beroperasi sepenuhnya setakat jam 8.30 pagi.

**"Pengeluaran air terawat telah kembali pada kadar normal dan pengguna akan menerima bekalan air seperti biasa secara berperingkat-peringkat apabila sistem agihan bekalan air telah distabilkan," katanya dalam satu kenyataan di Facebook pada Ahad.**

Jelas Air Selangor, bekalan air dijangka pulih sepenuhnya mengikut kumpulan satu dan dua yang mengambil masa antara 24 hingga 36 jam.

"Tempoh masa pemulihan bekalan air kepada pengguna adalah berbeza dari satu kawasan ke kawasan lain bergantung kepada lokasi dan jarak premis pengguna.

"Pengguna juga boleh mendapatkan senarai kawasan yang terjejas di laman sesawang <https://hentitugas.airselangor.com/> serta aplikasi Air Selangor," ujar kenyataan berkenaan.

Justeru, katanya, Air Selangor akan terus menggerakkan lori-lori tangki air ke kawasan terjejas dengan memberikan keutamaan kepada premis kritikal seperti hospital, klinik, pusat dialisis dan upacara pengebumian sepanjang tempoh gangguan bekalan air tidak berjadual ini.

**KUALA LUMPUR:** The water supply recovery in all areas of the Klang region affected is expected to be fully resolved at midnight.

Pengurusan Air Selangor in a statement said as of 6pm, the percentage of water supply recovery in the areas involved was at 73.9 per cent.

The affected areas include:

1. Armada Putera

2. Bandar Putera 23. Bandar Puteri
4. Jalan Raja Nong5. Kampung Pulau Indah
6. Kampung Teluk Gong 7. Kapar
8. Perindustrian Pulau Indah Fasa 29. Pulau Ketam
10. Taman Klang Jaya11. Taman Sentosa
12. Taman Sri Andalas

It said the recovery process was triggered by the reduction in the production of treated water at several water treatment plants involving the Rantau Panjang Water Treatment Plant, Sungai Selangor Phase 1 (SSP1), Sungai Selangor Phase 2 (SSP2), and Sungai Selangor Phase 3 (SSP3) treatment plants.

The reduction of water production was triggered following a water surge early Saturday morning (Aug 12) which resulted in high turbidity of raw water.

"Air Selangor would like to advise consumers who have and will receive water supply to let the tap run until the water is clear before using it for daily consumption.

"Air Selangor hopes that consumers who have received water supply will use water prudently to ensure that the recovery process in the still affected areas runs smoothly as scheduled.

"The water supply recovery period differs from one area to another according to the location and distance of consumers' premises.

Consumers can also obtain information on this unscheduled water supply disruption from time to time through our official communication channels such as the Air Selangor application, Facebook, Instagram and Twitter or call Air Selangor's Call Centre at 15300.

## Kampung Chempaka residents' water woes to end with new pipes

AFTER close to 50 years the water pipes in Kampung Chempaka, Petaling Jaya, are finally being replaced.

Over the years, the villagers have been facing low water pressure and in recent times there have been several burst pipe incidents.

A group of Pengurusan Air Selangor Sdn Bhd employees recently briefed villagers about the upcoming pipe upgrades at Jalan PJU 1/4D and Jalan PJU 1/11.

Also present at the briefing was Bandar Utama assemblyman Jamaliah Jamaluddin, who retained her seat in the polls.

“Since I became an assemblyman here the residents have always complained about low water pressure.

“It became critical to the point some could not use their washing machines as the pressure was too low.

“There were houses that could not use their showers because of the low-water pressure.

“We brought Air Selangor representatives to visit the affected homes so that they could get an idea of how it was affecting people’s lives.

“Air Selangor tried to increase the water pressure but the pipes started giving way.

“We are thankful to Air Selangor for deciding to change the pipes,” she said.

Kampung Chempaka village chief Theresa Lim said villagers were thankful to both Air Selangor and Jamaliah.

She said at the end of 2019, residents started complaining about poor water pressure and by June 2020, more complaints poured in.

“When our main pipeline at Jalan PJU1/4 bursts, we experience water cuts and it was troublesome as many seniors live here. We hope this project will solve our water problems,” she said.

The old pipes will be replaced with 180mm OD high-density polyethylene ones and works will start soon and be completed within a month.

Kampung Chempaka has a population of 9,000 residents and about 1,030 houses.

An Air Selangor spokesperson said residents would be informed of the exact date when work would begin.

“We will not impose charges on residents for upgrading works.”

## Ranhill seeks to expand water supply ops

PETALING JAYA: [Ranhill Utilities Bhd](#)  is actively exploring initiatives to expand its water supply operations to other states in Malaysia.

The company said in a filing with Bursa Malaysia that it is confident of being considered as a partner in the event any state government is looking to the private sector to collaborate in operating its water supply operations.

For its second quarter ended June 30, 2023, Ranhill's net profit rose to RM12.06mil from RM7mil in the previous corresponding period, while revenue grew to RM593.67mil from RM458.38mil a year earlier.
